Ordinance 2006- 10 to amend Chapter 224 of the code entitled "Public Records, Access to" 1st reading by title only and set public hearing date for July 10, 2006 Ouelette questioned fee of \$5.00 for copies when he paid \$.75 in another township. Corcoran – the only change in this ordinance is the procedure which allows the clerk to request payment for Xeroxing in advance. It's to avoid someone asking for copies requiring township employee time and resources and then not picking them up. First reading was then approved

Meeting open to the public:

Resident of Pennington Court: asked Corcoran to discuss information on the land swap for the path at Newton's Landing following walk

Corcoran: had discussed in executive session since it could potentially affect a contract. Nothing is resolved. Township Committee's direction is to not carve up the parcels. Township Committee's understanding of the swap was that Pulte would transfer land to Township which would transfer it to the county. County now seems uninterested in maintenance.

Resident: Didn't realize until walk that lawn areas were Newton's Landing's responsibility. They don't want to take on more.

Corcoran: Neither do we.

Resident of McKay Way: Thanks for the improvements to the site at Newton's Landing

Blvd. and Creek Rd. Last trailer and drainage remains

Corcoran: Unsung heroes – Phil and Walt

Resident: Silt fence is falling down

Rahenkamp: It will be taken care of tomorrow.

Hinkle: What happened to the ducklings?

Rahenkamp: A fox

Resident of Illinois Ave: Received a letter from the township inquiring as to interest in

the property adjoining his. Is interested

Corcoran: Send a letter of interest

Resident of Second Street: Trash at the river and Lilac – no can.

Fitzpatrick: We will put one there

Resident (Rahenkamp): Weeds need to stay to keep silt in place. The mound of topsoil

will be used.

Resident of Delaware Ave. (me): Regarding trash situation. When there is a holiday with only one collection per week, trash overflows the can at Union. People leave plastic bags of dog droppings beside the can. It's summer; that's not sanitary. Not sure what you do there, maybe a can at each street would help.

Fitzpatrick: We'll look into doing that.

Resident of Rivers Edge: Rental inspectors drop something new on you each year. Now fire extinguishers need to be #2 rated. You can't buy them in a store – have to special-order. Then you have to pay \$20 for reinspection.

Fitzpatrick: The state law changed. The extinguisher needs to be visible and mounted in reach and near a door. Reinspection fee should be waived since it's a new law

Hinkle: Residents were not even informed

Fitzpatrick: Letter that goes out for annual inspection should have new requirements.

Hinkle: The property owner has the responsibility though.

Lohr: We could do a courtesy mailing. I wouldn't like to see us establish responsibility for making residents aware of all the changes in state law. Operating a rental property is a business. It sets a dangerous precedent to make the township the responsible party.

Township doesn't even get the code books. The code enforcers do.

Resident: Township boards should tell the state, band together to get action. One person can't get anything changed. We've seen that here in town.

Lohr: We could work on a courtesy notice of significant changes.

Fitzpatrick: We should have a meeting of landlords.

Resident of Buttonwood Street: Who owns the property at Vine and Buttonwood? Why is there a trailer there?

Fitzpatrick: Grass there is too high and shrubs need to be taken out. Trailer is there as per temporary use for construction. Steve will look into code to see how long it can be there. Lot for sale at Hickory and Walnut needs to be cleaned up too.

Resident of McKay Way: Could there be a notice of how long the trailer can be on a property?

Lohr: Property owner has approvals for a duplex. Fitzpatrick: We will update at the July 10 meeting

Comments Township Committee:

Ouelette: Attended a program on eminent domain. Bill passed Committee to state Assembly as of today.

Hinkle: Weren't we going to have a roundtable of committees? Fitzpatrick: Yes, it should be on a Monday Township Committee night.

Fitzpatrick:

- 1. Township received an award from the Rancocas Conservancy for helping to protect the waterway.
